**Brief project description**

This Project represents the activities of SW-MY and four partner organisations, as part of the Durable Peace Programme.

The overall Durable Peace Programme (DPP) is managed and implemented by a consortium of 7 national and international organizations (Kachin Baptist Convention, Karuna Mission Social Solidarity, Metta Development Foundation, Nyein Foundation, Oxfam, Swissaid and Trocaire), and over 25 local Civil Society Organizations. The long-term goal of the DPP is to contribute to lasting peace, reconciliation, and sustainable development in Myanmar, with a particular focus on Kachin and northern Shan. This will be achieved through a multi-faceted approach, supporting communities and civil society to lead this change, and engaging with authorities to respond to community needs. The Durable Peace Programme is a seven year project (2015-2022) funded by the European Union, with a total budget of 19.5 Million EUR. The second phase of operations started in August 2018.

The overall consortium programme supports the capacity of women and men to participate in key peace and development processes and engages with Myanmar government officials and ethnic authorities to support the needs of people living in Kachin and northern Shan, especially Internally Displaced People (IDPs). The programme supports conflict-affected communities to strengthen their resilience to the effects of living with protracted conflict. This means supporting IDPs to voluntarily return to their communities of origin or resettle in a place of their choosing when conditions are conducive. It also means bolstering the incomes of conflict-affected households and contributing to social cohesion between diverse communities. The programme is committed to reducing gender-based violence while supporting women’s leadership and empowerment, ensuring women have more opportunity to participate in important decision-making processes, and have their specific concerns addressed. In phase two, the programme will also continue to deepen the expertise of civil society in Kachin and northern Shan, as well as respond to what we learnt from communities and adapt accordingly, enabling the programme to provide meaningful, context-specific support.

As part of the larger consortium DPP programme, SW-MY will work in partnership with four local organisations, and aims to reach 900 households in approximately 32 conflict affected communities in Kachin State.
